Maeve Sheridan and her brother, Michael Eustace, both shared a passion for good-quality beer so setting up their own brewery was a natural progression for the siblings.

Maeve, who has a background in finance, was working in Luxembourg when she developed a fondness for the various European-style beers. Michael, who is a civil engineer by profession, had always been a keen home brewer. Noticing the rise in craft breweries opening around Ireland, they decided to open their own brewery.

And they already had the perfect location – their family farm in Kilcloher, Kilmaley, Co. Clare. Maeve and Michael aspired to create beers that embodied the charm and character of their idyllic hilltop farm which has been in their family for 8 generations. The shed that houses the brewery was built by their great-grandfather nearly 100 years ago. And so, after much market research, and many experimental batches, Western Herd was born in November 2015. Maeve's background in finance helped when they were setting up the business and, through ACORNS, she received much support from fellow participants.

Western Herd launched with four types of beer and has since increased its range to a core range of 8 beers with seasonal brews available throughout the year. The beers are widely available throughout County Clare, including their own pub McHugh's in Ennis, the reigning Clare bar of the year, and in several off-licences nationally and online. Just this year, the company started exporting to Italy and France.

Western Herd has won numerous awards, most recently receiving Gold and Silver by RateBeer.com for its Back Beat Witbier and Siege in January 2018. With a team of nine between the brewery and pub, Maeve and Michael have ambitious plans for Western Herd, which include continuing to export, and creating a visitor's centre at the farm, so people can experience where the beers are brewed.
