Originally a cowshed and pigsty on her husband Kevin's family farm, the building was transformed into the thriving business it is today.

Caitriona, an engineering graduate with an MBA, once faced long commutes but dreamed of a lifestyle that better connected her work to her surroundings. In 2017, she and Kevin renovated the farm building into a welcoming gift and coffee store with a cozy outdoor terrace to soak in their view. Since then, Moher Cottage has become a haven for locals and visitors alike, offering Irish-made crafts, unique gifts, Caitriona's own artisan fudge, and her photography. Supporting local businesses remains central to her ethos.

The shop's reputation grew quickly—its coffee was crowned the best in Ireland by Today FM listeners soon after opening, and featured both nationally and globally. Through ACORNS, Caitriona found mentorship, inspiration, and even some of the talented designers and craft makers whose creations now grace her shelves.

In 2018, Moher Cottage expanded its reach with an online store offering international shipping. Recently, Caitriona added visitor tours to enhance the experience.

Her goal? To make Moher Cottage the best little shop in Ireland. With its blend of breathtaking scenery, quality Irish products, and warm hospitality, she's well on her way.
